Wolds Ward Healing Update August 2017

Crime

There have been 30 reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for July, of which three have occurred in Healing.

As reported last month, during the evening of 6th July, a premises on Pegasus Way, EuroParc, was entered by forcing a rear fire door. Vehicle keys were stolen.

Between 22 & 25th July damage has been caused to a window frame of a property on Hawthorn Close.

The third report relates to an assault.

Into August, there has been a single report to date (4th). This was over threats made due to an alleged debt.

There have been two reports of ASB, both relating to youths on the playing field at Poplar Road being abusive and causing general annoyance.
