Wolds Ward Healing Update February 2017

Crime

There have been 31 reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for January, of which nine have occurred in Healing.

Between 20th & 22nd January a garage was broken into on Lucas Court. A Boardman Sport bike was stolen.

Overnight 9th & 10th January, an insecure car parked on its drive on The Avenue was entered. Cash was stolen.

Between 6th & 8th January a vehicle parked on Hornbeam Drive was damaged after somebody scratched the number 3 into a door panel.

Overnight 8th & 9th January a car parked on Quantock Gardens had damage caused by scratching along the offside of the vehicle.

Other crime include a theft of a car battery from a drive on Station Road on 12th January, two assaults, distributing indecent photographs over public media sites, and a report of harassment.

Moving into February, between 11.30 & 12.30 on the 7th, a van was stolen from a building site on Carr Lane whilst the owner was working on the site. This van was recovered in Immingham on 9th February, having had tools stolen from the van.

There has been no reports of ASB.
