Wolds Ward Healing Update June 2016

Crime

There have been 49 reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for May, five of which have occurred in Healing.

Overnight 7th & 8th May, a metal shed in a garden on Wisteria Drive was broken into. A black & yellow Carrera Kraken mtb, child's car and tools were stolen. A wooden shed was broken into at a property on Cornflower Close between 21st & 23rd May. Tools and fishing equipment were stolen.

A wing mirror was smashed off a vehicle parked in the street on Buddleia Close overnight 25th & 26th May.

A male has been arrested and enquiries are continuing in to an allegation of a sexual offence.

A report was made regarding school pupils in-appropriate use of social media sending photos to others. This matter has been dealt with.

And from the end of April, about 6pm on 30th, two males were seen by officers on Oak Road. Following a search, they were found with herbal cannabis. Both have been interviewed regarding this incident.

There was two reports of ASB during May, one of which is an ongoing neighbour issue. Youths were reported throwing stones at a vehicle on Poppy Mews.
