## Wolds Ward Healing Update June 2017

### **Crime**

There have been 46 reported crimes across the Wolds Ward from 1<sup>st</sup> May to 13<sup>th</sup> June, of which thirteen have occurred in Healing.

As reported last month, during the early hours of 2<sup>nd</sup> May, a home on Snowdrop Close was entered and car keys stolen. These were then used to steal a car from the driveway. The car was later recovered on Patrick Street.

Over the same period, two insecure cars parked on a driveway on Snowdrop Close were entered. Tools were stolen.

And, a car parked on Clematis Avenue was entered. Nothing was stolen.

And, over the same time a car parked on Mallard Close was entered. An iPod was stolen.

Other crime include:

Theft of a toy from a bag left in Healing school.

A male who was refused entry into the scout hut on Poplar Road made threats to burn the building down.

A power tool was stolen from an address on Fords Avenue, however was later returned.

The padlock securing the Bowling Green has been broken off.

Damage to fixtures & fittings at a home on Forsythia Avenue by youths who attended the address whilst parents were away, after they were asked to leave.

A report of harassment and assault.

There have been two reports of ASB both regarding youths at the Bowling Green.
