Wolds Ward Healing Update October 2016

Crime

There have been 37 reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for September, ten of which have occurred in Healing.

Overnight 15th & 16th September, a garage door on Ivy Farm Court was forced. Two cycles were stolen along with other items. On discovering the break-in, the owner searched the area and found the property pushed in bushes along a nearby pathway. All the stolen property was recovered.

Also over the same period, an insecure shed in a garden on Stallingborough Road, Healing was entered. Two cycles were stolen.

About 4am on 25th September a shed in a garden on Stallingborough Road was forced open. A bike and power tools were stolen.

About 4.45am on 29th September, an attempt was made to break in to the Beechwood Farm Pub. A window was damaged but no entry gained.

A car was damaged at the Healing Manor Hotel when another vehicle deliberately drove into, following a civil dispute.

A male received a caution for damage following a domestic argument at a property in the village.

There were two reports from the EuroParc. One related to a theft of a wallet from a company on EuroParc, whilst the other was an incident involving an employee claiming racial abuse against managers after he was asked to leave the premises due to his behaviour. Two assaults have been reported. A male has received a caution following a minor assault that occurred during a domestic dispute, and an assault on the victim by a neighbour.

There have been no reports of ASB.
