Wolds Ward Healing Update October 2017

Crime

There have been 27 reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for September, of which eight have occurred in Healing.

On 5th September, a male in a vehicle causing an obstruction on Radcliffe Road made threats to another motorist causing her to fear for her safety.

On 14th September a tow bar cap was stolen from a vehicle parked at Healing Primary School.

On 24th September a motorbike was stolen from a property on The Avenue. It was abandoned in a ditch and attempts were made to set fire to it.

On 24th September a drunken woman got into a taxi that had not been booked for her. She was racially abusive towards the driver, punched him in the head and damaged the car.

A report of assault and damage followed a domestic related incident on Station Road.

A report was made of sending threatening texts to a person causing distress.

There have been two reports of ASB. Eggs have been thrown at a property on Station Road, and a similar report on Cowslip Court.
