Wolds Ward Healing Update September 2017

Crime

There have been 30 reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for August, of which seven have occurred in Healing.

As reported last month, damage was caused to a vehicle parked on the car park of the British legion Club around teatime of 5th August.

During the evening of 12th August a purse was stolen out of a handbag during the HealingFest.

Enquiries are continuing to trace the offender after an incident when about 2.45am on 26th August, a taxi dropped a fare off at Station Road, Healing. The fare refused to pay and was racially abusive to the driver before walking away from the vehicle.

A theft has been reported after it was found that a package delivered to an address through the Royal Mail had been opened, the contents removed, and the packet resealed to make it appear as it should.

Other crime reported include two separate incidents of making threats over the phone, and an allegation of assault at the HealingFest.

There have been two reports of ASB to date, both in relation to a resident lighting large garden fires.
