Healing Parish Council Notes from August 2015

The Parish Council held its usual monthly meeting on Tuesday 8th September 2015 and it saw a visit from the Dementia Action Alliance, whose representative spoke to the members about its work in the area and how the Alliance can work with local groups and bodies to provide help and support. A follow up article will be published in the next edition of the Newsletter by the Alliance.

Highways and Footpaths

The Parish Council has approached NELC about the possible stopping up of the layby on Great Coates Road as it has serious concerns about fly tipping and overnight parking within the layby and will be following up these ideas with NELC. The Parish Council has also suggested that a possible weight restriction might be viable and appropriate for the village and this too is being discussed with NELC to see if anything can be put in place.

The Primary School also advised the Parish Council that it has been speaking to the Royal British Legion Healing Branch to see if its car park could be opened and put to use during school access times to alleviate some of the parking problems around Fords Avenue, Nicholson Road, Oak Road and surrounding streets. This is ongoing between the School and the

RBL.

Poplar Park

The Parish Council is continuing its dialogue on the issue of potential local management of the park with NELC and the Parish Council has also now been asked if it would consider taking on the management of the Fords Avenue Park/Play Area as a double package. The Parish Council has seriously considered the options following the recent residents' consultation and has revisited its proposals with NELC, asking for a longer-term package with increased financial support from NELC over a longer period of time. NELC is considering this request by the PC and a response is now awaited.

Healing Village Hall

Decorating quotations will be sourced for the decorating of the hall to refresh its overall appearance inside. Electrical works have now been completed with sensors fitted in areas such as toilets and kitchens to reduce the power being used at the Hall in an effort to save money.

Future Dates

The Parish Council members regularly attend training sessions and meetings with other local organisations and bodies and will be representing Healing at the ERNLLCA Conference in October over in Hull as well as representing the village at the Town and Parish Council Liaison Meeting held at Grimsby Town Hall in September, the ERNLLCA North East Lincs District

Committee in October, an SLCC Workshop at Leeds for the Clerk during November, a workshop on the transfer of Community Assets during early September and the Mayors Civic Service in late September.

Finance

The Parish Council authorised all payments for the month and formally approved the renewal of its insurance for 2015/16.

Next Meeting

The next meeting will be on Tuesday 13th October 2015 at 7.00 pm at Healing Village Hall. As always, the press and public are most welcome to attend.

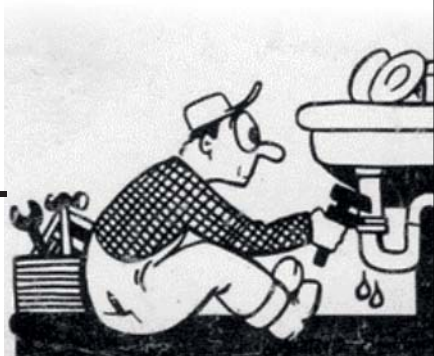

METHODIST CHURCH

As I write this letter I'm feeling a mixture of sadness and shock. I have just learnt of death of a former President of the Methodist Conference, the Reverend David Gamble. I knew him through my role as the Lincolnshire District Representative to the Methodist Council, which David has chaired for the last three years. He cared passionately about making the Methodist church a safe place for all people, worked tirelessly with Anglican colleagues to create closer links between the two churches, and was a genuinely kind, caring and fun person.

The tributes to him on social media bear witness to the way that he has touched so many lives and it makes me wonder how often we paid these tributes to him when he was alive to hear them. Knowing David he would have been embarrassed by any fuss, but I hope that he knew how much he was appreciated. The same could go for many of the people who we spend our time with. Do we let them know how much we appreciate them?

When St Paul was writing to the young churches of Asia Minor and Europe in the first century, many of which he had visited personally, he never failed to open his letters with thanks. Thanks for what God had done for him, thanks for what the people of that church were doing for the Lord and for each other. He wanted to encourage and build up those communities in any way that he

could, even if on occasion he also had to reign them in and refocus them as well. St Paul would also send greetings to individuals in those churches, praising and encouraging and giving thanks for their individual ministries.

Perhaps we could make this month one in which we seize every opportunity we can to build up those around us. Tell our loved ones what they mean to us, even if they already know it! Thank those who look after us for the service that they provide – be it the postman who rings the doorbell with a smile on his face, the receptionist at the doctor's surgery, or the local shop-keeper. And if we have colleagues at work or in voluntary organisations let them know how much we appreciate their support! If we get braver at doing so, then I pray that we will see our communities, families and friends flourishing, as, in St Paul's words, the Lord makes 'you increase and abound in love for one another and for all.'

POLICE REPORT FOR WOLDS WARD HEALING – UPDATE SEPTEMBER 2015

Ongoing priorities during September

Priorities for September will be to maintain high visibility foot and cycle patrols in Healing and surrounding areas, to provide reassurance, and help prevent and detect crime and anti-social behaviour.

If you feel that there are other issues affecting you or your local community that should be given priority, please inform your local councillors or your Neighbourhood Policing Team.

Crime

There have been 20 reported crimes across the Wolds Ward to date, 4 of which have occurred in Healing.

Overnight of 13th & 14th August, there was an attempt to break the padlock on the cellar door at the British Legion club, but no entry was gained. During the early hours of 14th August, intruders removed a UPVC window to gain entry to a house on Fords Avenue. Once inside, property including car keys was stolen. The vehicle was then stolen from the garage of the home.

Between 11am and 3pm on 21st August, offenders have approached an empty house on Stallingborough Road, Healing. After kicking in the rear external door, to enter the property, they have then kicked in an internal locked doors in to the kitchen and the garage. It is unknown if any property has been stolen.

Officers are investigating a report of theft of jewellery from a house whilst the occupants were on holiday.

Just one report of ASB on the evening of the Healing Fest. Officers attended but found no further issues.

Other news

Lifestyle 2015 is now well under way. It is open for youngsters aged between 10 and 18 years who live or go to school in the Humberside Police area. Once the team of between two and five people have registered, they can begin work on their chosen project. Work carried out will be logged in a work book provided, which will then be judged. There are many prizes, including trips to theme parks, a performance car track day, Wales, France, and the top prize of a trip to South Africa! All encouragement should be given to any teams working on their projects.

How you can help

Your local Neighbourhood Policing Team appreciates the importance of being in the right place, at the right time, for the right reasons to reassure the public, improve public confidence and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour in the area in which we all live and work.
