**Healing Parish Council Notes from August 2016. The Parish Council held its usual monthly meeting in August.**

## **Highways & Footpaths**

The Parish Council has now submitted a bid for funding from the Police and Crime Commissioner towards the possible purchase of ANPR cameras for the village and this matter will be updated as required.

NELC is still considering issues around the parking restrictions on verges and footways and will be updating the Parish Council shortly with a start date for the scheme to be in force.

## **Planning Applications**

Planning applications discussed at the August meeting were as follows:-

**DM/0666/16/FUL 34a The Avenue Demolition of existing bungalow and detached garage. Erection of 2 Dwellings and one detached building (incorporating 3 garages). Conversion and extension of existing dairy to create 1 dwelling, new shared driveway with amended access to highway and associated landscaping and to receive visit and short presentation from development team re site above.**

No objections.

**DM/0697/16/FUL 8 Buddleia Close Erect two storey extension to front.**  
No objections.

**DM/0312/16/FUL Fairview, Rowan Drive**

**Erection of two dwellings with the installation of rooflights, new access and driveway, parking and landscaping.**

Objections - Reiterate that two houses on the plot in unacceptable.

**DM/0594/16/FUL Land at Rookery Road**

**Demolition of garage and erection of a single storey dwelling.**

No objections but ask for condition that it remain single storey only with no upper floor

**DM/0708/16/FUL**

**Land off Hornbeam Drive**

**Variation of condition 2 (approved plans) attached to planning application DM/0439/15FUL for amendments to house types.**

No objections.

## **Healing Village Hall**

The kitchen refurbishment has now been completed with regard to the new kitchen cabinets etc. and the last remaining part of the works is the installation of new flooring which has now been ordered and will soon be installed.

## **Future Dates and Reports**

The Parish Council has been represented at both the ERNLLCA District Meeting and the Town and Parish Liaison Committee meeting. Upcoming dates include the ERNLLCA Annual General Meeting, the Mayors Civic Service from NELC and the ERNLLCA Annual Conference to be held in November.

## **Healing Cenotaph**

The Parish Council has booked in a clean for the Cenotaph which will be carried out shortly. The Parish Council is also continuing its discussions with the Legion with regard to a possible ornamental railing at the Cenotaph on which wreaths could be placed and this will be further discussed at the September 2016 meeting of the Council.

## **Poplar Road Park**

A formal final request has now been made of NELC for the Parish Council to take over the management of both Poplar Road and Fords Avenue parks by the Parish Council. A report/repair list for the pavilion building has been compiled and considered by the Parish

Council with repairs to be undertaken by NELC, and this will now be progressed via a site visit.

## **Finance**

The Parish Council authorised monthly payments and also has approved the first quarterly accounts with bank reconciliations for the first quarter of fy 16/17.

## **Next Meeting**

The next meeting will be on Tuesday 13th September 2016 at 7.00 pm at Healing Village Hall. As always, the press and public are most welcome to attend.

# HEALING VILLAGE SOCIETY

## TRIP TO LINCOLN. 15TH JULY

Thirty-one of us departed for Lincoln by coach at 9.20 a. m. On arrival Ann Appleby distributed the tickets – good value at £13 - for entry to the Cathedral and Castle.

Unfortunately, the Magna Carta display was closed because of humidity problems; later it was revealed that a hole in the roof, which has now been rectified, was the culprit. There were two short 180 degree wide screen films explaining the historical context of the signing of the Magna Carta. As compensation we were all given gratis a glossy booklet and a second free visit within six months. We dispersed for coffee and to visit cathedral or castle. I visited the Memorial Poppies first and was initially disappointed as I had expected more cascading down from the castle walls.

Generally, the restoration of walls, buildings, and medieval walk was excellent, with easy access by spiral stairs and lifts enabling us to enjoy huge panoramas from the wall walks. The inside of the prison chapel, with its enclosed pews and deliberately uncomfortable bench seats sloping downwards, had also been renovated. The Georgian and Victorian prisons were also open.

Members visited the Cathedral, noting the disturbing Duncan Grant murals and the recent statue of the Madonna, with an unusually mature face, and

child. Coffee in the cloisters while we watched the Peregrine falcons circling the central tower concluded a most enjoyable day for us. Chairman, Graeme Hytch, thanked Ann for organising another successful outing before we departed at 4.30pm.



## VIEW FROM THE PEW

I'm writing this letter the day after Super Sunday – not a Christian feast that you have never heard about, but rather the day when Team GB won 8 medals at the Rio Olympics! It was a day full of excitement, with winners and losers both showing their emotions. While every gold medal winner was full of joy, sometimes those who had won silver or bronze seemed to feel that they had failed in some way; perhaps because they had not replicated a previous gold medal win, or did not achieve their personal best. I just stand in awe of all the athletes who achieve a medal at these games. But I also remember all the many other athletes who turn every event into a competition; those for whom just being a part of the Olympic games is a lifetime achievement, even if they know that realistically they stand no chance of getting a medal. Each of them has a story to tell, of years of training, days of struggling, aching bodies and mental determination to not quit. The focus of these athletes who remain anonymous to all but their close supporters is just as great as those who become household names.

St Paul used the image of athletes competing in a race to encourage the early Christian believers to keep going through difficult times. He reminded them that whereas athletes competed for a laurel wreath (the equivalent of today's gold medal), Christians were promised a much greater prize – an imperishable crown and eternal life in

Jesus. And the writer of the letter to the Hebrews added practical training advice on how to achieve that crown – keep your focus on Jesus and don't be distracted.

There are over 2 billion followers of Jesus in the world today. We won't ever know their names individually, but each one is running the race. Like athletes in training there will be days when nothing goes right, when it is a struggle to live up to the values of God's kingdom, when they stumble and fall. But there will be others days when they are the best that they can be – forgiving those who have hurt them, praying for enemies, caring for those around them, doing a thousand loving acts of service that are taken for granted or not noticed, yet each of which make a difference. They may never be publicly acknowledged with honours and awards, yet they are each winners as they strive to follow Jesus.

Maybe you know someone who is one of these unsung heroes; if so perhaps you could find the time to encourage them and to cheer them on, just as the crowds in the stadium cheer on their team. Maybe you yourself are one of them! If so take a bow! The Olympics will soon be just a memory, but the difference we can make as we strive to follow Jesus can last forever.

# WOLDS WARD HEALING UPDATE

## AUGUST 2016

### **Crime**

There have been 29 reported crimes across the Wolds Ward for July, eight of which have occurred in Healing.

About 8am on 17th July, a male walking home from a nights fishing at Pegasus Way with his dog was stopped by a van. The occupants then scuffled with the male and made off with his dog in the van. The dog was later returned to the owner.

About 1pm on 14th June a window at a property at Ashleigh Court was smashed.

Other reports relate to four assaults. A male was arrested after he assaulted a female on The Avenue, when he tried to leave the scene of a road traffic collision. Another was dealt with by community resolution at the request of the female victim. The other two incidents were between young people and are still under investigation.

There were two incidents reported at Healing Manor in relation to an ex-employee. These matters have been dealt with.

One report of ASB where a male was causing annoyance in a car on Hornbeam Drive continually sounding his car horn.

# TRAVELLERS ADVICE

Village residents, particularly those who have followed the Grimsby Telegraph coverage, will be aware that a group of travellers recently moved onto some private land at Habrough, stayed there for a few days, and then moved on leaving behind them piles of rubbish, soil, broken concrete, and even human excreta for the landowner to clear up.

At the time the Immingham and Wolds Community Policing Team posted this advice:

“NELC Trading Standards are alerting all residents, but specifically those in the post code areas DN33 and DN35 to be alert to doorstep callers offering driveway/ block paving installations. The advice is before you even consider committing to what may appear a bargain priced driveway being installed you make sure that you have a written quotation that includes the name and full address for the trader [and not just a trading name and a mobile number ] and you ensure that the work has been completed satisfactory before you pay any monies .

It is also very important to ask, copy and retain the certification that the doorstep caller should hold that licences the trader to dispose of the rubble and debris from your old driveway legally . Please be aware that as a householder you are ultimately responsible for any waste that originates from your

property and could be ultimately fined if the waste is fly tipped.”

There was then a further message from the police regarding the rogue traders that were operating in Healing Village recently, most of which also applies to doorstep traders offering other services and goods.

“A similar group have been operating in Waltham and tried to charge an elderly couple an excessive amount of cash for a driveway. Two males were arrested for Fraud by False Representation and enquiries are ongoing.

Please DO NOT part with your hard earned cash unless it is with a reputable tradesman.

DO NOT be pressured into having work done.

DO NOT negotiate. Politely say NO. Any reputable tradesman will not force you to have work done.

Please look out for your elderly and vulnerable relatives and neighbours and report any suspected Rogue Trading.”

It is now apparent that some Healing residents and those from other local villages were caught out by these traders and suffered poor workmanship, incomplete work, and excessive prices.

Some residents, particularly the elderly and those living alone, find the presence of these travellers in the area very worrying.

**The only way to stop them is for no one to employ them.**

Further advice has been issued by NELC Trading Standards:

“Tips to avoid doorstep crime include:

Always check the identity of the doorstep caller by telephoning the company they are claiming to be from. Use the telephone number listed in your local phonebook or off the company website. Do not use a number the caller gives you.

Check whether traders are members of the Local Authority Assured Trader

Schemes or the Government Trust Mark Scheme.

Discuss any work you feel needs carrying out on your property with a relative or a friend who can help you find a reputable trader.

Don't agree to anything on the spot, or sign anything.

Do not feel pressured into having work carried out

Never pay cash upfront and don't ever go to the bank or cashpoint with a trader”
